On behalf of Management, the Office of LeAgratirs (OLA) requests that the Operations and Regulations Committee (Omittee) recommend that the Board of Directors (the LSCoPard) authorize publication a proposed Notice of Rulemaking Workshops to explore ruleking options for revising LSC s Private Attorney Involvement (PAI) Regulartiin a manner responsive to the recommendations of the Pro Bonos Reforce Report (the Task Force).

The proposed Notice of Rulemaking Workshops includes several Topics of Discussion that lay out the general period of the moderated panel discussion. The Topics of Discussion track the threcommendations of the Task Force. Public commenters are invited that recommendations for additions, deletions, or modifications of the general poics for Discussion prior to the Workshops and during a discussion at the first Workshop.

III) Discussion of the Rulemaking Protocol.

LSC's Rulemaking Protocol, 67 Fe \Re eg. 69762 (November 18, 2002), provides that

As an adjunct to the Notice and nonent Process, LSC will, when appropriate, conduct Rulemaking Workshops. Rulemaking Workshops will enable LSC Board mebers and staff to meet with stakeholders prior to the developmenta draft NPRM to discuss, but not negotiate, LSC rules and regulations. LSC believes the Notice and Comment process clading Rulemaking Workshops, will allow for an effective dialog between LSC and its recipients and other interested parties, in thiosstances in which Negotiated Rulemaking is not used.

With respect to procedure, the Radeing Protocol requires that the decision to undertake a Rulemakilamorkshop be made by the Board:

When the Board has decided to initiate a rulemaking and to conduct a Rulemaking Workshop, OLA will work with the Board and staff to select a date for Rulemaking Workshop and will invite participants from the intedeed stakeholder community.

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The Rulemaking Protocol envision that LSC Board members will be participate in or be live observers that Rulemaking Workshop. The LSC Board is also responsible for providing LSQ fft with policy direction for any proposed regulatory change.

Upon the conclusion of the Wdmkp, the Board shall provide LSC staff with policy guidance on the described staff in the development of the Draft Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM).

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IV) Next Steps.

Management requests that the Committee ommend to the Board that LSC staff and the LSC Board conduct Rulenngk Workshops regarding changes to the PAI regulation.
