

Sarah M. Singleton Santa Fe, NM Danilo Cardona, Director of LSC's Office of Compliance and Enforcement ("OCE"), forwarded to me your letter of May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2006, in which you request reconsideration of Office of Legal Affairs ("OLA") External Opinion ("EX") 2003-1010. Upon review of your letter, EX-2003-1010 and EX-2003-1014, I find no basis upon which to rescind or amend EX-2003-1010. My analysis is set forth below.

As I understand it, OCE recently completed a draft CSR/CMS report to Bay Area Legal Aid ("BALA") in which OCE found a violation of the attorneys' fees restriction in 45 CFR Part 1642 because BALA collected and retained attorneys' fees. The case was a housing case in which the lease had an attorneys' fees provision that provided for the landlord to be entitled to attorneys' fees in the event that the landlord prevailed in litigation with the tenant over the lease. California law provides that such clauses
